The Planning Committee for the 2012 Pediatric Hospital Medicine conference has dedicated two sessions to “Clinical Conundrums” and new this year, a poster session. Each presentation session will consist of 3-4 Case presentations, which will each last about 20 minutes. If your case is chosen, you will be given about 12-15 minutes to present the case and then allow for about 5-8 minutes for questions and discussion. This year, in addition to the Clinical Conundrums Sessions, we will select additional cases for poster presentation for a poster session to be held during the conference.

We are in search of interesting or challenging cases that have a definitive or likely diagnosis, but either initially presented as a diagnostic dilemma, was ultimately diagnosed with an unusual condition or as an unusual presentation of a more common illness.

You will be recognized as a presenter at the conference. Unfortunately, we can offer no other honoraria or financial support.

Please submit a brief case report (less than 1500 characters, approximately 250 words) that includes your name, key discussion points and suggestions for style and format of presentation. If applicable, please include a list (or actual attachments) of supporting clinical information, such as radiographs, pathology slides, etc. The entire submission is expected to be HIPAA compliant.

Submissions are due by March 1, 2012.

Cases will be chosen and presenters notified by **March 15, 2011.**

Final drafts of power point slide presentations will be due by **May 1, 2011.**
